Bill and Session Summary

Regular Session- ENRTF Appropriations

Bills including 2020 LCCMR recommendations / FY 2021 appropriations (<u>HF 30</u> [Hansen et al.] and <u>SF 166</u> [Ingebrigtsen et al.]) were introduced in the House and Senate and were heard in committee in the House.

Bills including the 2021 LCCMR recommendations / FY 2022 appropriations, including COVID-related extensions requested for projects ending June 30, 2021, (<u>HF 151</u> [Hansen et al.] and <u>SF</u> 690 [Ingebrigtsen et al.]) were introduced in the House and Senate and were heard in committee.

The House and Senate eventually both added 2020 and 2021 appropriations and COVID-related extensions to their omnibus natural resources appropriation bills: <u>HF 1076</u> and <u>SF 959</u> but with significant differences between the two. The bills passed each respective body.

A <u>conference committee</u> was called to resolve the differences between the House and Senate versions of the bill and meetings were held, but agreement was not reached before the regular session ended.

First Special Session ("SS1") - ENRTF Appropriations

The House and Senate versions of the omnibus environment and natural resources appropriation bill, SS1 <u>SF 20</u> (Ingebrigtsen; Tomassoni) and SS1 <u>HF 5</u> (Hansen), were amended in each body to include LCCMR 2020 tentative recommendations, 2021 recommendations, COVID-related extensions, and a requirement for ENRTF recipients to conduct criminal background checks on employees, volunteers, and contractors working with children.

SS1 HF 5 was heard in House committee and an informational hearing was held.

SS1 $\underline{\text{SF 20}}$ passed the Senate on 6/22/21 with a vote of 49 Y-16 N and was sent to the House. SS1 $\underline{\text{SF 20}}$ Passed the House on 6/25/21 with a vote of 99 Y- 34 N.

The bill was signed into law as Chapter 6 by Governor Walz on 6/29/21.

The differences between SS1 <u>SF 20</u> and the LCCMR 2020 tentative/2021 recommendations are as follows:

2020s

- All projects tentatively recommended by LCCMR are included
- One project has amount decreased: 04a/70-B *Unprecedented Change Threatens Minnesota's Pristine Lakes*, Science Museum of Minnesota, by \$118,000 to \$482,000
- One project has amount increased: 04e/098-B *Developing Strategies to Manage PFAS in Land-Applied Biosolids,* Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, by \$404,000 to \$1,404,000
- One project is modified: *Wastewater Renewable Energy Demonstration Grants*, LCCMR/PFA. \$1,095,000
- 8 projects are added:
 - Workshops and Outreach to Protect Raptors from Lead Poisoning, U of MN, \$133,000
 - o Lawns to Legumes, BWSR, ~\$998,000
 - o Birch Lake Recreation Area, City of Babbit, \$350,000
 - Wastewater Pond Optimization, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, \$700,000
 - o NRRI-Mineral & Water Research, U of MN, \$750,000
 - o Chloride Pollution Reduction, MN PCA, \$500,000
 - o CWD Prion Research in Soils, U of MN, \$336,000
 - Emerging Issues Account, LCCMR, \$284,000
- Background check requirement for projects providing children services is added
- LCCMR recommended technical and extensions are included
- Appropriation end date on the tentatively recommended projects was extended 1 year past the original end date given the time passed since originally introduced in the 2020 session.

2021s

- All projects recommended by LCCMR are included at the recommended amount
- One project is added: Forest Health Research, Development and Demonstration (including 'Forest management assessment tool'), U of MN- NRRI, \$840,000
- Background check requirement for projects providing children services is added
- COVID extensions for projects expiring June 30, 2021 and who requested extension by April 30, 2021, are included

Other Bills of Interest

Incorporated into SS SF20 & signed into law

<u>HF 30</u> (Hansen, R.; Ecklund; Richardson; Lislegard; Fischer; Jordan; Huot; Lee; Sundin; Lillie; Becker-Finn; Acomb; Lippert; Wazlawik; Morrison; Hornstein; Stephenson; Hanson, J.; Xiong, J.; Vang; Masin; Howard; Pinto; Davids; Boe; Franke; Reyer; Bahner; Hassan; Jurgens). *Description:* Environment and natural resources trust fund money appropriated, and previous appropriations modified. **Includes 2020 LCCMR tentative recommendations.**

<u>HF 151</u> (Hansen, R.; Fischer; Jordan; Ecklund; Lillie; Becker-Finn; Heintzeman; Acomb; Lee; Morrison; Lippert). *Description:* Environment and natural resources trust fund funding provided, and money appropriated. Includes **2021 LCCMR recommendations and COVID-related extensions** requested for projects ending June 30, 2021.

<u>HF 2412</u> (Heintzeman) *Description:* Environment and natural resources trust fund appropriation recipients required to perform criminal background checks on employees, volunteers, and contractors that work with children.

<u>SF 166</u> (Ingebrigtsen; Tomassoni; Ruud) *Description:* Environment and natural resources trust fund appropriations and appropriation modifications. Includes **2020 LCCMR tentative recommendations**.

<u>SF 690</u> (Ingebrigtsen; Tomassoni; Westrom; Hawj; Dziedzic). *Description:* Environment and natural resources trust fund appropriations. Includes **2021 LCCMR recommendations and COVID-related extensions** requested for projects ending June 30, 2021.

<u>SF 1855</u> (Ingebrigtsen) *Description:* Environment and natural resources trust fund recipients requirement for criminal background checks on employees, volunteers, and contractors working with children.

Not signed into law

<u>SF 593</u> (Ingebrigtsen) *Description:* Funds to make annual payments for certain state-purchased land using dedicated revenues establishment; in lieu of taxes payment requirements modification; appropriating money. Creates and funds a special ENRTF account from which annual PILT payments would be made for lands acquired with ENRTF.
